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

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Curriculum Feedback Analysis Report Summary 2022-23

The curriculum feedback for the academic year 2022-23 was obtained from the following stakeholders in an online manner through standardized forms (Google forms):

- 1. Students
- 2. Teachers
- 3. Alumni
- 4. Professionals
- 5. Employers

Curriculum Feedback from the Students (UG & PG)

Feedback on curriculum was collected from 446 students (384 Under graduate & 62 Post graduate). 92.5% UG & PG students have opined that the outcomes expected out of course are in accordance with its curriculum. The degree of difficulty required to be consumed is acceptable and the curriculum is covered in classroom satisfactorily, including the reiterative learning for slow learners. 87.7% UG & PG students think that the knowledge gained through curriculum is applicable for clinical or practical conditions. Students opined that that there is a scope for self- and extra-learning in the curriculum. They have opined that they can participate in the learning process adequately. The curriculum generates an interest in the minds of the students. The textual reading material is clear and relevant. The objectives of the course are in accordance with the curriculum contents. 86.6% students satisfied about the size of curriculum in terms of the load on the student. 90.3% students have opined that the curriculum is up to date. The curriculum helps in making the students competent enough to manage the patients in clinical postings. The curriculum orients the students towards research satisfactorily.

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Curriculum Feedback from the Teachers

102 teachers of the institute provided their feedback on curriculum in an online manner. 86.7% teachers think that the sequence, extent and objectives of the courses provided in the curriculum is good. The structure of the program is satisfactory. The course outcomes are in tune with its curriculum. 92.3% teachers think that the course covers the latest technologies adequately. 83.4% teachers opined that the curriculum is designed taking into consideration the student's capabilities of understanding. 88.3% teachers think that language does not act as a barrier in effective delivery of curriculum. The learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the needs of students. 93.3% teachers opined that the curriculum maintains a good balance between theory and practical part. The curriculum has the capability to generate interest in the subject.

Curriculum Feedback from the Alumni

180 alumni of the institute provided their feedback on curriculum. They feel that the course has aided them to prepare them for their current employment or higher education. The modern/ recent topics are covered adequately in the curriculum. Alumni' (85%) think that the curriculum provided employment orientation to them. 


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Curriculum Feedback Analysis Report Summary 2020-21

The curriculum feedback was obtained from the following stakeholders in an online manner through standardized forms (Google forms):

- 1. Students
- 2. Teachers
- Alumni
- 4. Professionals
- 5. Employers

Curriculum Feedback from the Students (UG & PG)

Feedback on curriculum was collected from 423 students (369 Under graduate & 54 Post graduate) in online manner for the academic year 2020-21. Majority of UG & PG students have opined that the outcomes expected out of course in terms of demonstrability are in accordance with the curriculum. The degree of difficulty required to be consumed is acceptable and the curriculum has been covered adequately in classroom, including the reiterative learning for slow learners. Majority of the students (85.1% UG & 85.7% PG) opined that the curriculum is applicable for clinical or practical conditions. They have opined that the curriculum provides a scope for self- and extra-learning. Students have given their opinion that they can get involved in the learning process satisfactorily. The curriculum has the ability to generate an interest in the minds of the students. The textual reading material is clear and relevant. The objectives of the course are in line with the curriculum contents. Some students have expressed their concern over the fact that the extensive syllabus puts the load on them. Most of the students have opined that the curriculum is up to date. However, some of the PG students (28.6%) have suggested including the topics covering modern.

Curriculum Feedback from the Teachers

99 teachers of the institute provided their feedback on curriculum in an online manner. The sequence, extent and objectives of the courses provided in the curriculum was satisfactory. The structure framed for the program and learning values are satisfactory. The outcomes expected out of the course are pertinent and the curriculum aids the students to achieve the outcomes. Teachers are opined that the course is relevant with latest technologies. Student's capabilities of comprehension have been taken into consideration while designing the curriculum. Most of the teachers (86.8%) feel that language is not a barrier in effective curriculum delivery. The learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the needs of students. Teachers (95%) think that the curriculum maintains a good balance between theory and practical part. The curriculum can generate interest in the subject.

Curriculum Feedback from the Alumni

20 alumni of the institute provided their feedback on curriculum. All the alumni feel that the course has helped them to prepare them for their present employment. Modern or recent topics were covered satisfactorily in the curriculum. Alumni (85%) opined that the curriculum helped them orient them for the employment. The topics helpful for competitive examinations were covered in the syllabus. The clinical knowledge and the skills obtained through the course helped them in their career or higher education. The curriculum also took care of overall development and provided adequate research orientation.

Curriculum Feedback from the Professionals

The feedback on curriculum was obtained from 14 professionals. Most of the professionals (85.7%) think that the curriculum is need-based. It makes the student competent adequately. The curriculum provides the career orientation. The curriculum maintains a good balance between theory/ practical and the up-to-date technologies are covered. The institute delivers the curriculum to the students efficiently.

Curriculum Feedback from the Employers

Feedback on curriculum was provided by 10 employers. The curriculum of the courses is in accordance with the expected competencies and is application-based. The curriculum helps to instill professional ethics and social commitment values among the students. It also focuses on their communication skills, 30% of the employers opined that the curriculum needs to include more recent advances. 40% of employers think that curriculum does not focus on communication skills of the students. Majority of employers are satisfied with the competency of the students employed by them.

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

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
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

Curriculum Feedback Report 2019-20

Curriculum Feedback Analysis Report Summary - 2019-20

405 students (355 Under graduate & 50 Post graduate) provided an online feedback on curriculum for the academic year 2019-20. Majority of UG & PG students are of opinion that the outcomes expected out of course are in line with the curriculum. The course content depth is adequate and coverage of curriculum in classroom is good. Most of the students feel that the curriculum is applicable for clinical or practical situations. They think that the curriculum has a scope for self- and extra-learning. Participatory learning and involvement of students in the process of learning is satisfactory. The curriculum generates an interest in the minds of the students. They feel that textual reading material is clear and relevant. The objectives of the course are compatible with the contents of curriculum. Some students (23.4%) have expressed their concern over the fact that the extensive syllabus puts the load on them, especially in Final BDS. In this regard, few students have suggested that instead of having 8 subjects in Final BDS, some subjects may be included in previous years of study. Most of the students have opined that the curriculum is up to date. However, some of the students have suggested including the topics covering modern technologies. The curriculum helps in making the students competent enough to manage the patients in clinical postings. The curriculum orients the students towards research satisfactorily.

The feedback on curriculum was collected from 43 teachers of the institute in an online manner. They opined that the sequence, extent and objectives of the courses provided in the curriculum was good. The structure framed for the program and learning values are satisfactory. The outcomes expected out of the course are relevant and the curriculum helps the students to achieve these outcomes. Teachers are of opinion that the course is relevant with latest technologies. Student's capabilities of comprehension have been taken into consideration while designing the curriculum. Most of the teachers (69.8%) feel that language does not act a barrier in delivery of curriculum. But some teachers (30.3%) have opined that it may act as a barrier. The learning objectives are clear and appropriate to the needs of students. The curriculum maintains a good balance between theory and practical part. The curriculum has the ability to generate interest in the subject.

19 alumni provided their feedback on curriculum. Majority of them feel that the course has helped them in, and prepared them, for their current employment or education. Modern or recent topics were covered satisfactorily in the curriculum. They feel that the curriculum has oriented them for the employment. The topics useful competitive examinations were also covered in the syllabus. The clinical knowledge and the skills obtained through the course was useful in their career or higher education. The curriculum helped them in their overall development and oriented them towards the research.

The feedback on curriculum was obtained from 13 professionals in an online manner. Most of the professionals opined that the curriculum is need-based and makes the student competent. The curriculum orients the student towards the career. The curriculum has a good balance between theory/ practical and the latest technologies are included. Skill-oriented human resources are developed through learning process and professional ethics is instilled in the students. The institute delivers the curriculum to the students effectively.

10 employers provided their feedback on curriculum. They opined that the curriculum of the courses is in line with the expected competencies and is application-based. The curriculum instills professional ethics and social commitment values among the students as well as focuses on their communication skills. 30% of the employers think that the curriculum needs to include more recent advances. The curriculum helps to build

entrepreneurial skills which help them to start their own venture like private dental clinic. Majority of employers are satisfied with the competency of the students working with them.

101 parents provided their feedback on various aspects. Feedback analysis shows that on an average, more than 85% parents are satisfied with quality of teaching, discipline, examination system, various efforts taken to improve academics and the facilities provided to the students by the institute.

Curriculum Feedback Analysis Report Summary - 2018-19

Most of the students think that curriculum is in accordance with the competencies expected out of the course. The depth of course content is good & the curriculum is covered satisfactorily in classroom. The curriculum is useful for application in clinical situations faced by the students. Most of the students feel that they can participate & get involved in the learning process. The curriculum has the ability to generate interest in the subject area. Textual reading material available for students is clear & relevant. Some students feel that course content has not kept up with the modern times. The curriculum makes the students competent for treatment of patients during clinical postings. The curriculum provides good research orientation to the students. Students have suggested that certain topics which are outdated in terms of treatment (e.g. silver amalgam) should be omitted. Final BDS students have suggested increasing the clinical posting hours. Present curriculum is most adaptive as well as adoptive to the all sorts of environment within the campus and outside it. It helps the students to be in tune with trend in utilization of technology. It helps them to think independently and enhances decision capability.

Teachers are satisfactory with the sequence, extent and objectives of the courses provided in the curriculum. The curriculum helps to achieve the outcomes expected out of the course. The curriculum has been designed taking into consideration the student's capabilities of understanding. They feel that 'language' may act as barrier in curriculum delivery. The curriculum has maintained appropriate balance between theory and practical. The curriculum has the ability to generate interest in the subject. There is pronounced Teachers' ability to translate the curriculum in all spheres of applicability. Hands on training are required in few of the areas.

Alumni found the curriculum to be useful in relation to their current job or education. They think that education prepared them for their current profession. The curriculum also provides orientation towards employment. Topics included in the syllabus helped them to prepare for the competitive examinations. As per the agenda, following issues were discussed:

1. Confirmation of Last minutes of Meeting

Dean sir reviewed the action taken for the resolutions which were discussed in last college curriculum meeting conducted on 23-06-23 and confirmed the minutes of meeting

2. Status of UG Curriculum and Planning for 2023-24

Dean sir asked the Status of UG curriculum and Planning to UG Director Dr Jaykumar Gade. He informed that Summative MUHS examination of Second BDS Regular, Third BDS Regular and Final Referred Batch will be starting from 16/12/2023; whereas the examination of First BDS is staring from 16/01/24. 
